

Week 5: Spiritual Gifts

Day 1 Reflection

TRUTH

Read 1 Samuel Chapter 17 and answer the following questions.

What SHAPE did David have in this Chapter?

- S spiritual gifts how had the Holy Spirit gifted David?
- H heart -What passions did David have?
- A abilities -What comes natural to David?
- P personality -How has God wired David?
- E experience- What had David learned prior to this?

What happened when David tried to use Saul's armor? Why? What could this imply for us, when we compare ourselves with others or try to wear their SHAPE?

Think of a time when God gave you an assignment. What SHAPE were you given to complete the task? How did He equip you? Journal about this time using the letters, SHAPE.

Day 2 Reflection

TRUTH

When considering gifts that come from our Father, it is important to look to Scripture to see what God says about them. Read Matthew 25:14-30. What can we learn from this parable about the distribution of gifts, be they spiritual or natural ones? Who gives them? Are all given the same amount? (Important to note that one Talent is a very large sum of money, so all had been given a lot.) To whom do the gifts belong? What does this parable teach about why we are given gifts? What lessons from this parable can you take away for your own life? Take time to list out all of the gifts- spiritual and natural gifts that the Father has entrusted to you. Don't forget to list resources like a house, cars etc... Are you using all of them to build His Kingdom? Perhaps you need to ask forgiveness for burying what God has entrusted to you? If so, make a plan to remedy this. Journal all your answers/thoughts.


Dr Alex Rosenberg is a prominent atheist.

Day 3 Reflection



TACTICS

We are getting practical today ladies! And today it is about a new tool or tactic that you can use to effortlessly introduce spiritual topics into a conversation. Give it a try and then practice!

We are looking at something called the "Columbo Tactic".

Greg Koukl, from Stand to Reason, wrote a book called "Tactics" where he introduced methods that can be used to have conversations about spiritual topics. Here is an excerpt from their website:

The goal of the tactical approach is to stay in the driver's seat of any conversation without being pushy, uptight, or unpleasant, but also without having to be especially clever or knowledgeable. You can do that by learning a handful of simple techniques to help you deal with objections, manage aggressive challengers, and even turn the tables by exploiting the bad thinking found in many of the objections against Christianity.

Our theme verse is Colossians 4:5-6: "Conduct yourselves with wisdom toward outsiders, making the most of the opportunity. Let your speech always be with grace, seasoned, as it were, with salt, so that you may know how you should respond to each person." Simply put, Paul says we are to be wise, gracious, and tactical when talking with others about the things we believe.

Then look to Romans 12:3-8, Ephesians 4:11 and 1 Peter 4:8-11, for more examples of gifts from the Spirit. List these on your illustration as well. Do you have any of these gifts?
